Grade 1/2 – Mrs. Rempel

October was a wonderful month! We reflected on all the things we're thankful for, went on our first field trip with the kindergarteners, and enjoyed our Halloween celebration!

Our upcoming month will include wrapping up our first units in all subject areas. This will include our Science unit on Living Things, French unit on Les Saisons, and our "I Belong" Social Studies unit.

We've been busy learning all about numbers and building our fluency in our math number sense unit. This unit includes identifying number in various forms, building fluency with skip counting, and builds the foundations for addition and subtraction by reviewing friends of ten.

In literacy we continue to grow as readers and writers. We're focusing on our writing goals and loving our Letterland program with Mrs. Pilling. We have become professionals at our Daily Five Literacy centers and have begun guided reading with Mrs. Rempel.

The month of November will bring Remembrance Day, our first report cards and parent/teacher conferences. I'm looking forward to our parent/teacher conferences and celebrating your child's learning with you.

Grade 3/4 – Mrs. Hrymak

We have had a wonderful fall in Grade 3/4. The students have settled into routines and know the expectations of the classroom. In ELA, we are continuing our Daily 5 rotations. It has been great to listen to the students read and the students are progressing with their reading. We do not do a formal home reading program in Grade 3/4 but students are encouraged to practice their reading as much as possible at home. In Math, the Grade 3s are finishing up their unit on Place Value and the Grade 4s are working on addition and subtraction of larger numbers. We have been working on Habitats and Communities in Science and will soon start a project that pulls all we've learned together. Please stay tuned for information on this project. In Social Studies, the students have formed a very solid understanding of the Canadian provinces and territories. We will now move on to the variety of geographic regions in Canada. Every day, the students write in their planners so don't forget to check them for any important notes or dates. We are looking forward to Parent/Teacher interviews at the end of the month. Don't forget to check out Seesaw for the posts students make of the work they are doing.



Grade 5/6 – Mrs. Walker I can't believe we have finished 2 full months of school. We have been very busy here! It's almost time for report card writing so we are finishing up our units in health and social studies so we will be having a quiz next week in those subjects. We have one more writing project to finish before report cards as well. We have been working on writing proper sentences using capitalization and punctuation most of the time without reminders. We have also been working on self-editing work before it comes to me. This is a skill we will continue to work on. In math, we are continuing to work on basic recall of multiplication and division facts. We will be focusing on guided reading and more writing in ELA. We also will be studying Remembrance Day in the month of November.

Grade 7/8 – Mrs. Bootsman

As October ends, I can't help but reflect on how quickly the first two months of school have gone. We have accomplished many things in grade 7/8 with more to come. Both grades will be writing their first large math test in a couple of days on integers and their operations. In science, we have been exploring the use of a microscope and viewing things on slides. Everyone did a great job on their 3D model of a cell. Social studies has seen us learning about early societies and humans in pre-history. Soon we will be moving on to the early society in Egypt. Report cards are only a few weeks away, so we will be working on getting any last minute

assignments finished up and continue working on our subjects.

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

Graphic Organizers

Graphic organizers are a great way for students to sort information and can be used in all subject areas. Students can use these organizers to record information they are learning as jot notes, phrases, or sentences. Graphic organizers can improve comprehension and understanding of the text, improve student engagement with the text, help students develop vocabulary skills, as well as help students better understand text structure. Graphic organizers that focus on text structures such as cause and effect, compare and contrast, sequence, and problem and solution, help students understand how authors organize the text. Students can visually see the organizational pattern of the text which enables them to better understand text structure. Vocabulary graphic organizers can help learners visualize the connections between words and their meanings. Students can better understand the meaning of words as well as make connections to the vocabulary word. These graphic organizers can be useful to students learning new vocabulary in Math, Science, and Social Studies.
