It's hard to believe that Christmas holidays will soon be here! Time is just flying by in Kindergarten. We are very excited to be back in our newly painted classroom! It was great to see parents during parent-teacher interviews. It is so nice to get to sit down and talk about your child's successes at school. Every kinder has become an important part of our classroom and school community.

This month we will be talking a lot about Christmas, doing Christmas related activities, read Christmas books, and doing Christmas crafts. We will continue working away at our Jolly Phonics program this month. Please take some time to review and practice the letters at home. The songs that go with the letters were given out during parent teacher interviews. Learning letter names and letter sounds will help your child emerge into early reading and writing. Once we have completed, or nearly completed our Jolly Phonics program, we will begin literacy centers. During these centers we will practice with letters and sounds, as well as many pre-reading and pre-writing skills. We have also begun math centers in Kindergarten. During these centers, students practice many different early numeracy skills, such as, counting, number recognition, matching, patterning, printing numbers, and much more! We are wrapping up our Science unit on Trees and we will start our new Science unit on colours in the new year.

We have been getting ready for the Christmas concert. The Kindergarten students will be performing a couple of poems and a dance. I look forward to seeing everyone at the concert on December 14th. A note about our Christmas party will be going home soon. Keep an eye out for that in your child's B.E.E. bag. - Mrs. Belisle




