Menial Health and Wellness — Ms. Hofer Four Ways to Strengthen Your Child's Character

"Four Ways to Strengthen Your Child's Character." The Parent Institute, vol. 34, no. 6, Feb. 2023, p. 1.

Values help students make good choices, develop self-esteem, and become responsible individuals. Teaching values at home supports what schools are doing to create a positive school culture that helps all students learn. Here are four strategies to build your child's character:

- **1. Think about the values** that are important to you and your family. Talk about them openly with your child.
- **2. Teach by example**. Your example is the most powerful teacher of all. Ask yourself, "If my child watched my behavior all day, what lessons would it teach?"
 - **3. Set high standards**. Expect your child to act responsibly, to be kind to others and to tell the truth. Some families make it a point of family pride. "In the Smith family, we tell the truth."
 - **4. Talk about the Golden Rule**. Teaching kids to treat others the way they would like to be treated helps them make better choices. Ask your child, "Would you want someone to talk to you that way?"

Family Book Club – New Year – New Routine!

- #1 Everyone brings two books... one they are reading or just finished and one they want to read next.
- #2 Choose a consistent location that is comfortable and inviting
- #3 Invite everyone to help choose the format. Kids love to have a voice in who asks questions, whether sticky notes are involved, how often you meet, and what the group norms should be! Kids may like to write things down on sticky notes, while others may like to have a reading journal. Ask everyone to share a short passage they really liked from their book.
- #4 Have snacks... always!! Finger foods are great for book club discussions. Think candy, pretzels, veggies,
- #5 Go with the flow and keep it low pressure. Do not stress if it does not go according to plan! Its okay to end early, shift gears, or just try again next time. Keep it enjoyable for kids so that they keep coming back for more and develop that reader mindset.
- #6 Before ending your meeting, decide what you would like to tweak for the next time, when you'll meet again, and any family book club norms you'd like to add or revisit.
